## ABOUT CONROE ISD

Conroe ISD covers a large, demographically diverse region, encompassing 348 square miles, north of the Houston, Texas metropolitan area. Students in CISD attend seven high schools (Caney Creek High School, Conroe High School, Grand Oaks High School, Hauke Alternative High School, Oak Ridge High School, The Woodlands College Park High School, and The Woodlands High School), seven junior high schools, ten intermediate schools, 34 elementary schools, and three alternative placement centers.

## ABOUT CANEY CREEK HIGH SCHOOL

Caney Creek High School is a four-year, comprehensive high school, serving the needs of its rural, multi-ethnic student body of over 2,100 students through a diversity of curricular and extra-curricular activities. The school opened in the fall of 1997. Located 40 miles north of downtown Houston, Caney Creek High School, part of Conroe ISD, is located in rapidly-growing Montgomery County, Texas, near the city of Conroe.

## ACADEMICS

### COVID 19 UPDATES:

Conroe ISD provided asynchronous learning for all students between March – May 2020. Technology and Wifi hotspots were provided to students as needed (paper packets upon request). Students were required to complete at least one graded assignment per week in each class. In dual-credit courses, students completed both the college assignments, as well as the high school curriculum. Students in advanced placement courses participated in virtual review sessions to supplement coursework preparation for AP exams. This year, the school year began on August 12, 2020 with virtual instruction. Beginning on September 8, students had the option to continue five-day-a-week in-person or virtual school. In addition to the challenges of the pandemic, Caney Creek High School's entire school community dealt with Tropical Storm Imelda in the fall of 2019. This storm not only resulted in extensive flood damage to our school, but also displaced many of our students from their homes.

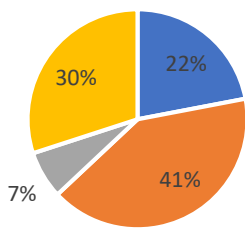

## GRADE POINT AVERAGE AND CLASS RANK:

Students take classes in a seven-period per day format, with grading periods occurring quarterly and final semester grades used in the calculation of GPA. Grade points determine rank in class. Class rank is based upon semester grades earned in grades 9 - 12. All subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Students must earn at least a 70 in a semester course in order to receive credit. In a year-long course, the average of the two semester grades (if the spring semester is passing) must equal a minimum of 70.

Rank in class is based on the weighted GPA. GPA is determined (on a weighted 5.0 scale) by dividing the total number of grade points earned by the number of classes taken each semester. Rank in class is determined by a high-to-low ranking of all GPAs in class.
